## **Minister's Message**

Greetings to all.

January seemed so long being away from you all. And yet, my time in Chicago studying at Meadville Lombard seemed so short. Intensives, as the January learning time are often referred to, is a time of concentrated study in an insular community. I wrote last time of my experience in observing the city of Chicago's reaction to President Obama's goodbye address. There was so much electricity, literally and figuratively. Being present for the Womans' March in Chicago was an experience that I will never forget. So many people, one of the second largest Marches. What impressed me was the diversity of participants: Men, women, children, Jews with yarmulkes on, ministers in clerical collars, Sikhs with turbans, Muslims with Hajibs nuns with veils, lots of pink pussy hats...all assembling peacefully and respectfully. At one point, a person fell and I saw the group stop, make a circle around the fallen marcher, so that the person had space to get up. No pushing or shoving or immediacy of movement. Everyone was interacting lovingly and kindly. "This is what democracy looks like" was the chant. I also thought, this is what love looks like. This is what caring looks like. This is what a community committed to justice looks like. And what was interesting was that space was held for those who walked, those who rode on scooters or wheel chairs, those who sat adjacent and cheered and those who observed from a distance through electronic participation. Some, like me, carried the names of friends who couldn't be physically present but who sent their spirit and energy. And for all the churches, temples and mosques that I have visited; I never felt a more sacred space than I did on South Michigan Ave that day. There was intention, devotion, energy, desire, dreams and hopes. All the things prayers are made of. In this time of resistance, talk back, accountability and witness; I want to hold up the sacredness of all the ways that people can participate within boundaries of comfort and ability. A common UU message is that service is our prayer. In whatever way we can serve to support the democratic process (which is one of our principles) and the upholding of dignity, truth and pursuit of justice; we engage in UU prayer. It doesn't look the same for each person and no one can or should say what level and amount of engagement is required. But this above all, engaging in any way to support the beliefs we speak in church out in the world and in the streets puts us in touch with the essence of love as our doctrine and service as our prayer.

There will be a **Health Fair on Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup> in Unity Hall**. Please save the date. The time will be determined at a later date. This event has been coordinated by Susan Frawley. Local health service providers will be on hand.

When feasible, please start transferring any plants to pots that you may wish to donate to the church for our rear garden and possible plant sale. This sale will be held at the same time as the **Garden Walk on Saturday, July 15, 2017**. There will be free bus transportation from a variety of commercial and residential sites on that day running from Portage Road, Main Street and Walnut Avenue.

As information becomes available, the board has expressed interest to the Jewish Community Services and the City of Niagara Falls that we wish to assist the settlement of the Congolese refugees who emigrate to the City. There is a long-standing tradition at our church to offer sanctuary to those in need. At this point, the process has been halted until organizers are sure that the refugees would be allowed to travel. Our hearts go out to all immigrant families, here and abroad, as their hope for safe haven hangs in the balance.

If you haven't heard, Ivy D'Amico is our new musician. I know you'll welcome her warmly.

**Daylight Savings Time resumes on Sunday, March 12<sup>th</sup>** so be sure to mark your calendars and spring forward as you adjust your clocks.

A Legacy Fund for the church was set up by a vote of the Congregation at a Special Meeting. The purpose of this Fund is to provide long range financial stability for the church.


