Within the last month there have been more killings in a school in the United States from someone with an automatic weapon. To those of us not in the "gun" culture it seems unbelievable that people can still defend their right/need/desire for owning these weapons. If this does become reality, I am hoping to open the doors of the church so that local students can come and make use of this time. We are close to City Hall which might be one of their destinations. We will also try to have other means for the young people to express themselves and learn more about how politics work and what positive measures can be taken.


SAVE THE DATE!

SUGGESTIONS FOR SPIRIT CARE

Excerpted from the sermon.

1. Go outside every day.
2. Choose news sources you trust and only follow those.
3. Choose two or three voices that you trust and focus your attention on what they are saying. Figure out who your leaders are right now, the people whose voices, wisdom, and experience help you.
4. Think about the two or three causes or issues you are most passionate about, that you feel most connected to, and keep your focus on those things.
5. Do something to build your resilience every day.
6. Do something to resist what you don't believe in and to support what you do.
